

Nomura Global Multi-Theme Equity Fund - MYR Class

Fund Commentary and Strategy

During the month, the Fund was mainly invested in the Target Fund.

Commentary from the Target Fund Manager

MYR Class returned +12.66% in April, outperforming the benchmark by 455bps. Looking at the style trends, Growth outperformed Value this month by 5.11% using MSCI ACWI Value/Growth figures including dividends. In terms of size, Large cap outperformed the rest using MSCI ACWI Large/Mid/Small Cap figures including dividends.

Attribution analysis showed this month's performance consisted of positive sector allocation and stock selection effects. Sector allocation contributed the most from overweight positions in Information Technology, Energy, and Consumer Staples sectors. As for stock selection, positioning in Information Technology, Consumer Discretionary, and Industrials had positive effects on the performance.

Main contributors to performance included overweight positions in hard disk and flash storage maker Western Digital, memory chip manufacturer Micron Technology, semiconductor and infrastructure software company Broadcom, Google parent Alphabet, and flash memory storage maker Sandisk. Notable detractors included overweight positions in pharmaceutical distribution giant McKesson, streaming entertainment leader Netflix, aerospace and defense equipment maker Safran, and cloud data platform provider Snowflake, along with a non-holding of Google parent Alphabet.

The US economy continues to demonstrate resilience despite headwinds from heightened Middle East tensions. March CPI accelerated sharply to +3.3% year-on-year from +2.4% in February, though real personal consumption remained firm at +0.2% month-on-month in March (February: +0.3%), supported by a drawdown in household savings rates. Non-farm payrolls rebounded strongly to +178,000 in March, reversing the prior month's decline of -133,000. While risks to growth and inflation from the Middle East situation warrant continued vigilance, a sharp economic slowdown appears avoidable. The April FOMC meeting concluded with rates held steady, and we will continue to monitor the evolution of both geopolitical developments and monetary policy direction closely.

Q1 2026 earnings results for major companies have broadly exceeded market expectations. We are also closely watching the potential inflationary and growth implications of rising oil prices, and their knock-on effects on central bank policy globally.

Over the longer term, AI-driven productivity gains are anticipated across a wide range of industries. Within the portfolio, we continue to rigorously assess companies' medium-to-long-term strategies, focusing on names where current valuations appear attractive relative to their growth potential, and will selectively add growth-oriented positions on this basis.

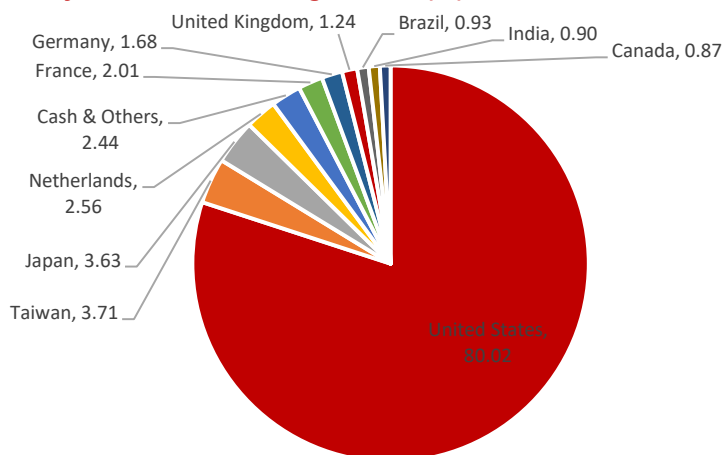

Theme Spotlight

[Investment Theme: AI/Big Data]

Within the Fund's "AI/Big Data" growth theme, we see significant potential for the market to broaden beyond initial hardware investment in data centres, which remain essential infrastructure for AI's ability to process vast datasets, into cloud environments running AI models and machine learning workloads, and further into AI-enhanced software delivering incremental value. As data processing increasingly involves sensitive and confidential information, the importance of cybersecurity is also growing, and we are paying close attention to companies operating in the security space.

[Featured Company: Snowflake]

One of the key names within this theme is Snowflake, a US-based software company that provides data warehousing services designed to help organisations efficiently consolidate and utilise large volumes of data generated across internal systems, application software, and cloud services. As the AI era unfolds, many enterprises are actively seeking to leverage AI for operational efficiency and new value-added service development. However, a significant challenge persists: much of the data held by corporations is stored in complex formats that are not immediately usable. Snowflake's platform enables companies to build the foundational data infrastructure needed to work with large and complex datasets efficiently, facilitating more secure AI adoption and application development. For these reasons, we believe Snowflake's medium-to-long-term growth prospects are becoming increasingly compelling.
