



## Nomura Global Dynamic Bond Fund - Class MYR

### Fund Commentary and Strategy

During the month, the Fund was mainly invested in the Target Fund.

### Commentary from the Target Fund Manager

In the month of May, Class MYR returned +1.26%. The fixed income market was characterized by significant volatility driven by geopolitical tensions in the Middle East and persistent inflation concerns. Global government bond yields reached multi-decade highs mid-month before retracing some of those gains toward the end of the period as de-escalation hopes emerged.

Investors focused on the US-Iran conflict and the news flow regarding AI and upcoming IPO of SpaceX throughout the month. Hope for a peace deal and the resulting market optimism supported risk assets. Nevertheless, risk assets ended the month positively.

The Fund's strong performance was driven by our exposures to Emerging market, Convertible bonds and Financials. Credit hedging detracted from performance as spreads moved lower.

The US-Iran conflict remained a dominant market driver, driving energy price spikes that pushed headline inflation higher. Oil prices responded accordingly: Brent crude peaked at 114 \$/barrel at the beginning of the month and eased below 92 \$/barrel towards the end of the month.

US Treasuries lagged other government bond markets given the robust economic backdrop as investors brought forward expectations for interest rate hikes. April's US labour market report surprised to the upside. Corporate bonds generated positive total returns and outperformed government bond markets. In the US, investment grade outperformed high yield where, on a sectorial basis, financials lagged a little. However, in the eurozone, high yield markets on average outperformed investment grade names. Emerging markets outperformed developed markets in May with risk markets performing positively for the month.

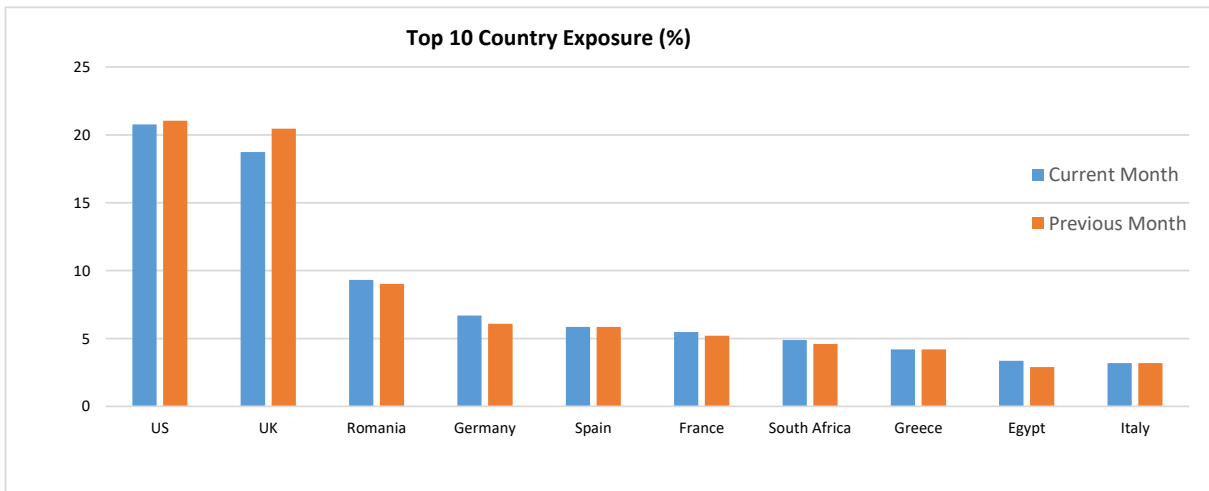

Based on the Fund's portfolio returns as at 30 April 2026, the Volatility Factor (VF) for the Fund is 6.33 and is classified as "Low" (Source: LSEG Lipper). "Low" includes funds with VF that are between 4.635 and 8.585. The VF means there is a possibility for the Fund in generating an upside return or downside return around this VF. The Volatility Class (VC) is assigned by LSEG Lipper based on quintile ranks of VF for qualified funds. VF is subject to monthly revision and VC will be revised every six months. The Fund's portfolio may have changed since this date and there is no guarantee that the Fund will continue to have the same VF or VC in the future. Presently, only funds launched in the market for at least 36 months will display the VF and its VC.

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
